

Site User Rules for 956B

Types of Waste Accepted:

Brush– includes yard trimmings, grass, mulch, trees leaves and branches. (See Special Conditions)

Construction & Demolition- includes but is not limited to lumber, shingles, brick, tile, cement, sheet rock, any debris resulting from the construction, remodeling and/or demolishing of a structure. (See Special Conditions)

Appliances-includes refrigerators, air conditioners, stoves, bicycles, water heaters, etc. (See Special Conditions)

Trash-includes household garbage or waste from residential or commercial operations, cabinets, boxes, etc. (See Special Conditions)

Tires - includes automobile tires or smaller only (See Special Conditions)

Class II Waste/Maquiladora Waste- (See Special Conditions)

Class III Waste-Non hazardous waste. (See Special Conditions)

Non-Regulated Asbestos- (See Special Conditions)

Sludge- (See Special Conditions)

Waste not acceptable for disposal:

1. Regulated Hazardous Waste other than municipal hazardous waste from CESQGs as defined in 30 TAC §335.78 (CESQG hazardous waste may be accepted, provided the amount of waste does not exceed 220 pounds per month per generator);
2. Class 1 Industrial Waste with the exception of wastes, which are Class 1 only because of asbestos content.
3. Lead acid storage batteries.
4. Used motor vehicle oil and Used-oil filters form internal combustion engines.
5. Whole used or scrap tires, per §330.5(e)(4);
6. Refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and any other items containing Chlorinated Fluorocarbon (CFC's), must be handled in accordance to 40 CFR §82.156(f) prior to acceptance.
7. Liquid Waste (some liquid waste is accepted and solidified prior to disposal as discussed in Section 4.23)
8. Municipal wastewater treatment plant sludge's, other types of domestic sewage treatment plant sludge's, and water-supply treatment plant sludge's; Unless it is determined to contain "free liquids" as defined by EPA Method 9095 (Paint Filter Test) and have received prior authorization for disposal.
9. Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCB) wastes, as defined under 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 761, or any material impregnated with these constituents.
10. Septic tank pumpings.
11. Grease and grit trap wastes.
12. Waste from commercial or industrial wastewater treatment plants; air pollution control facilities tanks, drums, or containers used for shipping or storing any material that has been listed as a hazardous constituents in 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 261, Appendix VIII but has not been listed as commercial chemical product in 40 Code of Federal Regulations §261.33(e) or (f)

Site User Rules:

1. No Regulated Hazardous Waste other than municipal hazardous waste form CESQGs as defined in 30 TAC §335.78 (CESQG hazardous waste may be accepted, provided the amount of waste does not exceed 220 pounds per month per generator);
2. No Class 1 Industrial Waste with the exception of wastes, which are Class 1 only because of asbestos content
3. No lead acid storage batteries, per §330.15(e)(1);
4. No used motor oil or used oil filter from internal combustion engines, per §330.15(e)(2);, per §330.15(e)(3) and 330.171(d)
5. No whole used or scraped tires, per §330.15(e)(4), unless split and quartered or shredded and they do not come from a tire disposer/recycler who is reimbursed from the state Waste Tire Fund:
6. No refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, and any other items containing Chlorinated Fluorocarbon (CFC's), must provide documentation of proper removal to verify compliance with 40 CFR §82.156(f) & CFC containing materials, per §330.15(e)(5) prior to acceptance (except as per Section 4.12 of this SOP);
7. No liquid wastes (some liquid waste is accepted and solidified prior to disposal as discussed in section 4.23), per §330.15(e)(6);
8. Municipal waste water treatment plant sludges or other types of domestic sewage treatment plant sludges, and water-supply treatment plant sludges are not accepted; unless it is determined to contain "free liquids" as defined by EPA method 9095 (paint filter test) and received prior authorization for disposal.
9. No Polychlorinated Biphenyls (PCB) wastes, as defined under 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 761, or any material impregnated with these constituents.
10. No septic tank pumping accepted.
11. No grease and grit trap waste.
12. No waste from commercial or industrial wastewater treatment plants; air pollution control facilities tanks, drums, or containers used for shipping or storing any material that has been listed as a hazardous constituents in 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 261, Appendix VIII but has not been listed as commercial chemical product in 40 Code of Federal Regulations §261.33(e) or (f)
13. No smoking or open flames on working face of Landfill
14. No scavenging or material removal allowed.
15. No closed drums/barrels accepted.
16. All open loads must be tarped and properly secured or may incur surcharge.
17. You are responsible for cleaning up of any spillage of your waste that you lose before you get to the working face.
18. Children must remain in vehicles.
19. City of Edinburg will not be responsible for lost or stolen items/property, or damages to vehicles resulting from the use of the facilities.
20. Fees will be based upon volume of loads.
21. Instructions from site personnel shall be observed.
22. All vehicles must yield to off road equipment.
23. No alcoholic beverages allowed on site.

**FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE REGULATIONS CAN INCUR PENALTIES AND OR
TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT SUSPENSION FROM THE LANDFILL.**

The following special wastes maybe received without prior approval form the TCEO but with the relevant analytical test results, MSDS documents, or process knowledge documents:

1. Septic tank pumpings, which have been stabilized and pass the paint filter test upon delivery:
2. Waste from commercial or industrial wastewater treatment plants, air pollution control facilities, and tanks, drums, or containers used for shipping or storing any material that has been listed as a hazardous constituent in 40 CFR, Part 261 Appendix VII, but has not been listed as a commercial chemical product in 40 CFR §261.33 (e) or (f):
3. Drugs, contaminated foods, or contaminated beverages, other than those contained in normal household waste:
4. Incinerator ash:
5. Light ballasts and/or small capacitors containing PCB compounds with a PCB content of less than 50 parts per million:
6. Waste from oil, gas and geothermal activates and any other processed subject to regulation by the Railroad Commission of Texas when those wastes are to be processed, treated, or disposed of at a solid waste management facility permitted under 30 TAC Chapter 330: and.
7. Waste generated outside the boundaries of Texas that contains any industrial waste of any waste associated with oil, gas, and geothermal exploration, production, or development activates; or any item listed as a special waste in this section.
8. RACM-- Regulated asbestos –containing material as defined in 40 Code of Federal Regulations Part 61, as amended, includes: friable asbestos material, Category I nonfriable ACM.
9. Pesticide (insecticide, herbicide, fungicide, or rodenticide) containers.
10. Soil contaminated by petroleum products, crude oils, or chemicals.
11. Waste generated outside the boundaries of Texas.
12. Slaughterhouse wastes.

Special Conditions:

Brush-must be free of any waste material not defined as brush (brush must be clean.)

Construction & Demolition-concrete or block must not exceed brick size.

Trash-must not contain hazardous wastes.

Appliances-written proof must be provided that refrigerant (CFC) has been properly removed from refrigerators and air conditioners, if no proof is available the compressors must be removed before acceptance.

Tires-rims must be removed, maximum size must not exceed 11.0 X 22.

Class II/Maquiladora Waste-requires prior authorization, waste profile sheet and manifesting.

Non-Regulated Asbestos-requires prior authorization, waste profile sheet and manifesting.

Dry Sludge-requires prior authorization, waste profile sheet and manifesting.

Covered Loads-all loads must be covered or tied down to avoid 15% penalty charge.

The City of Edinburg Reserves the right to determine waste acceptability based on State or Federal Waste Screening Regulations
