Edinburg, Texas - It is with great sadness that the City of Edinburg announces the passing of Fire Chief Shawn Snider. Chief Snider, who served the City of Edinburg for more than three decades, passed away on May 1, 2023, after a courageous battle with cancer.

"Chief Snider was an exemplary public servant who dedicated his life to protecting the people of Edinburg. He was a true leader who inspired his team to be the best they could be, and his legacy will always live on in the Edinburg Fire Department," Mayor Ramiro Garza Jr. said. "Our thoughts and prayers are with Chief Snider's family and his other family at the Edinburg Fire Department during this difficult time."

Chief Snider joined the Edinburg Fire Department in January 1991 and quickly rose through the ranks to become Fire Chief in 1999. During his time as Chief, he worked tirelessly to improve the department's response times, increase training opportunities for firefighters, and enhance public safety in the community.

"Our hearts are heavy with the loss of Chief Snider. He dedicated his life to serving our community, and his selflessness and bravery will never be forgotten. We extend our deepest condolences to his family, friends, and colleagues during this difficult time," City Manager Myra Ayala said.
